Edisa Weeks is a Bedford-Stuyvesant based choreographer, educator, maker, curator and founder of DELIRIOUS Dances. She creates multi-media interdisciplinary work, that merge theater with dance to explore our deepest desires, darkest fears and sweetest dreams. She grew up in Uganda, Papua New Guinea and Brooklyn, NY. She's had the pleasure of working with Annie–B Parsons Big Dance Theater, Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Co., Dance Brazil, Jane Comfort, Jon Kinzel, Muna Tseng, Reggie Wilson Fist & Heel Performance Group, Sally Silvers, Spencer/Colton Dance, among others. She is a member of the Skeleton Architecture collective and teaches technique, improvisation and choreography at Queens College. www.deliriousdances.com.

Edisa Weeks in making one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five roots out of paper and twine. 1865 represents the year that legalized chattel slavery ended in America. The roots are part of a performance installation, THREE RITES: Liberty, and will dangle from the ceiling to the floor to create an environment that the audience separates and moves through (as if moving through history), to find open spaces containing reflections on liberty.

Darryl Montgomery [artist pseudonym Darryl Hell] is an arts educator who teaches media literacy, American cultural history and engaged civics, a citizen journalist, arts mentor / educator, strategic consultant, veteran multi / mixed media artist & producer, musician, documentarian, turntablist, artivist, community organizer, public speaker, and theatrical technical director. Since the late 1970's, he has focused his efforts on studying the intersections between innovations in technology, personal / community development, and organizational structure. From 2003 to 2012, he was an Internet Strategic Consultant for six-term Congresswoman Cynthia McKinney, with a Congressional win in 2004. His community work includes creating a community greenspace in Bed-Stuy, restructuring and bolstering block associations, mentoring, and providing community / infrastructural development workshops for Green Thumb.

Purpose Lounge creates and teaches innovative strategies of personal and community team building and outreach. We address issues of personal development, non-ownership complex, and social / media literacy through historical civics. Our program takes the perspective that cultural history, media literacy, and civics are the cornerstones of any truly empowered person and/or community.

Samira Rajan was named CEO of Brooklyn Cooperative Federal Credit Union in October 2008. She is also the Executive Director of the credit union's 501c3 affiliate, Grow Brooklyn.
